SAINT OF THE WEEK

<u>ST CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA (287-305) – Feast Day: 25th November</u> Patron Saint: Philosophers, preachers, young women

St Catherine was the daughter of Constus, the Governor of Alexandria, which at the time was one of the finest cities in the world - a centre of learning and culture as well as faith. Thanks to her noble birth, Catherine was well educated and of high intelligence. It is said that at about age 14 she experienced a vision of Mary and Jesus as a Child, that prompted her conversion to Christianity.

When the Roman Emperor, Maxentius visited Alexandria he commanded his soldiers to bring Catherine to him because as well as being extremely clever, Catherine was well known for her beauty and the Emperor wanted to see her for himself. Undaunted by being presented to the Emperor



Catherine berated him for his cruel persecution of Christians. Amazed at her audacity, Maxentius had his most gifted orators and philosophers' debate with her to persuade her that her Christian faith was nonsense. Catherine was moved by the Holy Spirit and spoke so eloquently about her Christian faith that many of the Emperor's men were converted...and subsequently put to death.

Maxentius was furious and had her scourged and then imprisoned. She was scourged so cruelly and for so long that blood poured from wounds all over her body. But throughout her torture she was serene. The Emperor then ordered her to be imprisoned without food or water so that she would starve to death. It is said that angels came and took care of her. Twelve days later, when the dungeon was opened, a bright light and fragrant perfume filled it and Catherine came forth even more radiant and beautiful.

Having failed to change her mind about her faith through torture, Maxentius tried to win her over by proposing marriage. As his wife, she would be an extremely powerful empress but Catherine refused saying that she was married to Jesus Christ. Infuriated at her rejection and frustrated that he couldn't change her mind about her faith the Emperor ordered her execution by a most cruel means, the breaking wheel. The breaking wheel is an ancient form of torture, a brutal punishment that results in a slow and painful death, normally reserved for the worst criminals. When Catherine touched the wheel, it broke into pieces and she was spared this horror. Incensed, Maxentius ordered her to be beheaded. Catherine herself ordered the execution to commence and it is said that a milk-like substance rather than blood flowed from her neck. Legend tells that Catherine's body was taken by angels to Mount Sinai, where God had given Moses the Ten Commandments. There is a monastery dedicated to St Catherine there to this day that holds her remains, which still emit a sweet fragrance after all this time.

St Catherine is venerated as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, a group of saints venerated together because their intercession is believed to be particularly effective, especially against various diseases. This devotion, began in Germany during the time of the Bubonic Plague with the veneration of 3 Virgin Martyrs - St Catherine, St Margaret of Antioch and St Barbara. Over time other saints were added who offered protection against particular illnesses. St Catherine is prayed to guard against sudden death and diseases. St Joan of Arc said that St Catherine of Alexandria, along with St Margaret of Antioch, visited her and were appointed her divine advisers.
