INTRODUCTION

On the occasion of a funeral families are invited to make early contact with the clergy of the parish and spend some time in discussing the appropriate arrangements. When a Requiem Mass is celebrated these arrangements will normally involve the following:

- 1 The Priest will help you choose the readings which best express the quality of Christian living of the deceased and set before us the basis of our faith the Resurrection of Christ and our hope of Resurrection. Members of the family can be asked to deliver the readings during the Mass, but be mindful of the situation that the family will be facing on the day of the funeral. The Priest will also choose the Gospel Reading. Secular readings or poetry are not acceptable as part of the Liturgy. Normally the Responsorial Psalm will be sung by a Cantor.
- 2 Bidding Prayers may also be led by a relative or friend of the family after consultation with the celebrant of the Mass.
- 3 The parish can provide an organist and a cantor to support the congregation in the singing. Any other provision must be discussed in advance with the celebrant of the Mass. The hymns will normally include an Entrance, Responsorial Psalm/hymn, Offertory, two Communion Hymns and a recessional hymn. The Communion hymns should always have a Eucharistic theme and hymns in honour of the Blessed Virgin or other Saints are not appropriate at this point in the Mass. Secular music or songs are absolutely excluded from the Funeral. A selection of sample hymns may be found toward the end of this booklet.
- 4 A eulogy is permitted at the start of the Mass. It can be a beautiful way to honour their life du

It can be a beautiful way to honour their life during the Requiem Mass. If you choose to offer a eulogy, it's typically shared by a family member or friend at the start of the Mass. Keep it brief, about four minutes, to fit within the liturgy's flow while sharing a heartfelt tribute, any more than this time is not suitable for the setting of the church. Reflect on the person's life—their faith, kindness, or moments that showed who they were. Speak from the heart, perhaps sharing a story that captures their spirit or how they touched others. Tie it to the hope of resurrection, central to our Catholic faith, to uplift those gathered. Write your thoughts down and practice aloud to ensure it feels natural and stays concise. The text must be sent to the priest in advance.

Family members who are involved in arrangements should participate to the extent that they feel able under the circumstances. The Celebrant of the Requiem Mass/Service will be happy to provide such support as required from the wider parish community (e.g., readers etc).

The appropriate title for an order of Service in the Catholic Church is:

REQUIEM MASS FOR THE REPOSE OF THE SOUL OF

RESPONSORIAL PSALMS

The Psalm is usually <u>sung</u> by a Cantor. The clergy will help you choose a suitable psalm.

Bidding Prayers

The response is: Hear our prayer

1. For our sister/brother (Name) who ate the body of Christ, the bread of life, that she/he may be raised up on the last day.

2. That those who bear the cross of pain in mind or body may never feel forsaken by God.

Other Arrangements

• Ashes

If a cremation is part of the funeral arrangements, then please adhere to the guidance from the Catholic Church. The ashes of the loved one should be buried as a whole and not scattered or made in to trinkets.

• Car Parking

You should note that there are limited car parking spaces available in the church car park.

Kirkwood Street operates a permit system for resident's parking only. Parking Attendants patrol the street regularly and issue a £60 fine to those without a permit.

Parking is available at Rutherglen Exchange shopping centre – entrance via Greenhill Road, at a cost of £1 for 3 hours.
